Affidavit of service filed by the petitioner be kept on record.

Mr. Dey, learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is a physically disabled person and is residing at premises no.12/1, Padmapukur Lane, Kolkata 700020. Some local miscreants illegally entered her house and threatened her of dire consequences. Such fact was immediately intimated to the police authorities by a complaint dated 12th December, 2018 but the same has not been treated as FIR and no criminal case has been registered. Aggrieved thereby the petitioner has approached this Court.

Ms. Nag, learned advocate appearing for the State respondents submits that the complaint of the petitioner has already been treated as FIR and Ballygunge Police Station Case No.4 of 2018 dated 8th January, 2019 under Sections 341/323/506/34 of the Indian Penal Code has been registered and investigation is in progress. Let the documents, as produced, be kept on record.

Under such circumstances, this Court directs the investigating agency to conduct investigation in the aforesaid case in a fair and impartial manner and to conclude the same as expeditiously as possible.

As the petitioner is a physically disabled person and as she is residing with her aged mother, the respondent no.8 is also directed to ensure that no physical harm is caused to the petitioner and her mother.

With the above observation and direction, the writ petition is disposed of.

There shall, however, be no order as to costs.
